APR/MAY/JUNE 2016

April 30, 2016: Provided an all-day (8-hours) training on "**Culture Accessibility/ Culture Competence.**" The attendees comprised of Valley-wide mainstream DV service providers and members of the South Asian community. There were over 30 attendees and six members of ASAFSF team.

The main trainer, Rabeya Sen, was from out-of-state, specialized in the subject of Cultural Accessibility as being "*a fundamental – concept linked to inclusion, representation and promotion of citizenship*". The concept was new to many, but more comprehensive in approach, and was very well received by attendees and there were requests for more such, as evidenced by the detailed Satisfaction Surveys completed.

Rabeya was supported by ASAFSF Executive Board member and Director of Training, Doreen Nicholas who opened with a brief review of domestic violence and it's effects on the communities. Attendees have requested more such trainings.

June 1, 2016: 90 minutes Culture Competence workshop was conducted by ASAFSF Project Director, Lubna Tabassum, for the Gilbert DV Task Force Collaboration. This was a follow-up after the training on April 30. There were 7 attendees, and was very well received, as evidenced by the Satisfaction Surveys completed and returned.
